### The Wilderness Yet 27th April 2023

The Wilderness Yet are singer Rosie Hodgson, fiddler Rowan Piggott and guitarist-flautist Philippe Barnes. Their distinctive name comes from Inversaid by Gerard Manley Hopkins, a lovely rhythmic poem evoking the wonders of nature and untouched landscapes. Opening songs from their last two albums opened each half of the evening - The Beauties of Autumn the first and Wild Northeaster the second. Others included Charlie Fox. A Bruton Farmer. Woman of the Woods and the clap-along The Thrushes' Anvil as well as many more. The two halves of the evening were perfectly balanced (not always the case at Baston) and included songs from their three available albums, all of which are highly recommended. At one stage Rosie briefly left the stage to allow Rowan and Philippe to show off their considerable instrumental skills. It must be noted that Phillippe is also a talented flautist as well as guitarist. ### **Past Times**

It is joyous June again. A time for village markets, fairs and fetes. Baston has enjoyed these celebrations since 1257. On October 24th 1257 at Westminster, King Henry III granted 'a charter to the abbot and convent of Croylaunde of a weekly market on Thursday at their manor of Baston, co. Lincoln, and a yearly fair there on the vigil and the feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist and the three days following'; (CChR, 1226–57, p. 476).

Records suggest a market in 1261 probably held back as severe frosts, three harvest failures and whole flocks of sheep and cattle died creating famine. Brilliantly our 700th anniversary in 1957 featured a gigantic pork pie from the Co-operative Bakery in Peterborough, delivered on a trailer. The pie evidently weighed 300lbs (136 kilograms) and 6 feet x 3 feet wide x 4.5 inches deep (1.83x0.91x11cm).

Villagers enjoyed a joyous pageant of children in 13th century costumes with a queen and courtiers. Photos exist of the pie, cut into 1100 portions then served on ironstone souvenir plates for 3 shillings (15 pence). That Sunday the packed-out church service heard a sermon by the Bishop of Lincoln accompanied by joyful hymns - as a flash of lightening and crack of thunder shorted the lights and the organ!
